**FOUR TEAM SPOTS LEFT FOR PRESTIGIOUS CHILDREN'S
CHARITY CLASSIC BENEFIT AT EAGLE SPRINGS**

**EVENT TO BENEFIT YOUTH FOUNDATION AND VAIL VALLEY
MEDICAL CENTER'S CHILDREN'S PROGRAM**

Event to benefit Youth Foundation and Vail Valley Medical Center's
Children's Programs \$220,000 set as goal for event

WOLCOTT, Colo.—August 5, 2010—The Eagle Springs Golf Club, the
premier private golf club in the Vail Valley not associated with a real
estate development, will host the inaugural Children's Charity Classic
golf tournament established to raise money for two of Vail's key non-
profit groups focusing on the needs of the Valley's children: The Youth
Foundation www.theyouthfoundation.org and Eagle Care
www.vvmc.com Children's Program.

At press time, only four of 18 team spots are left for interested golfers
who can play the prestigious and pristine Eagle Springs Golf Club in
Wolcott for a great cause.

The Youth Foundation prepares children in need for success in life
through education and recreational opportunities and mentoring; Vail
Valley Medical Center's (VVMC) Eagle Care Children's Program provides
childhood wellness care to the uninsured and under insured children
who live in Eagle County.

The August 10, 2010 event marks the first major fundraising golf
event at Eagle Springs and was conceived by Eagle Springs's members
who recognized a community-wide need, given the current economy

and many of their members' volunteer efforts on behalf of both organizations.

The field of 22 four-person teams will each pay \$10,000 with individual slots available for \$2,500 in this one-day event. With early word-of-mouth buzz, the event is 90 percent filled with a full field expected by next week.

"Our members saw a definitive need to help our Valley's youth and came up with this concept during the 2009 Christmas holiday," explained Fred Green, Founder and Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of Eagle Springs. "Several of our members have personal experience with both organizations and came up with a creative and benevolent way to help many children while having a good time on the golf course. One hundred percent of the money collected will be in service of the charities."

"We are grateful for the inspiration of Eagle Springs's members," said Susie Davis, Executive Director of The Youth Foundation. "This event is just one illustration of the generosity and vision we often see in our community."

Doris Kirchner, CEO of Vail Valley Medical Center, echoed the response. "Our mission is to provide superior health services with compassion and exceptional outcomes. Eagle Care Children's Program is a vital part of our mission and this event is a tremendous step in furthering the ability of the hospital to have an outreach that extends deep into our community."
